Wishing all our villagers a very happy spring time from the Bardsey Gardeners.

We had a very enjoyable, and at times rather silly, AGM back in February. What a success our ' Tool Tales' was! Thanks for all the stories and the fascinating items brought along - from the allotment seed drill (never used) to the World War One mattock, the nifty weed remover to the hedge snips. Plus who could forget Nigel's extra long dibber?

If you spend any time in your garden or with plants, you'll know that things are really kicking off now out there. I am planting seeds and enjoying being out in the sun – this time of year is always so exciting as there are new things shooting and rooting by the day.

I am down at the allotment today – planting peas, chard and parsley. As an RHS member I was able to purchase ten envelopes of seed from their own gardens for just £10 including p&p. I'm trying a few new things this year as a result including caraway seeds today – a member of the carrot family, if they grow well they should have pretty white cow parsley type flowers and pungent seeds to use in cookery.

Here at BG we are putting together our calendar for summer socials. We meet in the garden of a member to have a look at their plot, have a chat and sometimes enjoy a glass of wine! The first of these will be in June this year – looking again at a private rewilding project in the village. If you'd like to join us and are not currently a member please drop us a line at **bardsey.gardeners@gmail.com** Membership is a mere £5 per year, or £10 for your whole household.

We have also booked a date to go again to see the National Collection of Delphiniums near Rothwell – because it was so magical last year. This is a private collection and there is little chance to see it outside of private visits. Colin has hundreds of different varieties of these eight foot tall blue majestic plant beauties. If you'd like to join us on **Wednesday 11 June** please email us, there will be a small charge that goes towards the charity supported by the garden.

Our popular annual plant sale is on **10 May**. When we will be teaming up with the WI again to provide tea, cake and bacon sarnies on the morning. Plant donations from 8.30am, teas open at 9.30am and the plant sale itself from 10am. There is usually a queue, so get there early – and be aware that were normally **pretty much sold out by 11am.**

## Exploring the Cosmos and Championing Sustainability

At Bardsey Primary Academy, our commitment to fostering curiosity and environmental stewardship has led to a series of enriching activities for our pupils. Recently, we've embarked on exciting afterschool astronomy sessions, launched a comprehensive learning thread on Sustainability, Science, and the Environment, and actively participated in local ecological initiatives.

#### Astronomy Sessions and the Spectacular Planetary Alignment

Our young astronomers (and older ones too, parents!) have been captivated by the wonders of the night sky during our recent astronomy sessions. A highlight has been observing the rare planetary alignment recently; all seven planets—Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune—have been visible in the evening sky, a phenomenon not to be missed and we were able to view Saturn's rings, the moons of Jupiter, and get some very clear pictures of the moon.

Children have learned that such alignments, where planets appear closely grouped in the sky, are uncommon and offer a unique opportunity to observe multiple planets simultaneously. Equipped with telescopes and guided by our enthusiastic staff (and parents again!), pupils have identified these celestial bodies, deepening their understanding of our solar system.

## Introducing the Sustainability, Science, and the Environment Learning Thread

This year, we've launched our "Sustainability, Science, and the Environment" curriculum thread, designed to engage children with pressing environmental topics through hands -on experiences. Each year group participates in tailored activities that connect classroom learning with real-world applications.

For instance, our Year 3 pupils will soon be visiting Drax Power Station in North Yorkshire. This trip will teach them about renewable energy production and environmental conservation efforts, such as the Skylark Centre and Nature Reserve, and the opportunity to witness firsthand how reclaimed industrial sites can transform into havens for wildlife.

Later this academic year, we will see the introduction of our own bee hives! Our Year 4 pupils will have weekly apiculture sessions, learning about the importance of bees when it comes to the environment and ecosystems.

#### Supporting the Climate Change Garden

In our ongoing effort to work with the local community, Bardsey Primary Academy is proud to support the Climate Change Garden located just across the road from our school. Our pupils have actively participated in tree planting activities, contributing to the creation of a green space that serves both as a community resource and a living classroom.

At Bardsey Primary Academy, we believe that by combining learning with practical experiences, we can inspire the next generation to be informed and proactive stewards of our planet.

#### **Table tennis in Park Field**

The table tennis table has now been successfully reinstated in a newly paved area close to the adult fitness equipment in Park Field. It is hoped that many people will enjoy using this facility.

## Hedges overhanging pavements on roads and public highways

We have had many complaints from villagers about hedges encroaching and overhanging pavements, especially on Keswick Lane, Margaret Avenue, Mill Lane and other areas of the village. Please consider your neighbours and cut back hedges if they are narrowing the pavements and becoming a danger to pedestrians and especially for people in wheelchairs and parents with prams and pushchairs.

#### **Unstable Trees**

In the Bardsey area there has been concern relating to unstable trees in some gardens and trees in woods which back onto the A58. If you have trees which look tall and unstable in your garden and/or own a wooded area please seek advice from a tree specialist. Residents have an obligation as follows.

The National Tree Safety Group (www.ntsgroup.org.uk) state that tree owners have a legal duty of care. Under both the civil law and criminal law, an owner of land on which a tree stands has responsibilities for the health and safety of those on or near the land and has potential liabilities arising from the falling of a tree or branch. The civil law gives rise to duties and potential liabilities to pay damages in the event of a breach of those duties. The criminal law gives rise to the risk of prosecution in the event of a failure to discharge'

#### Hedges adjoining public rights of way

There are many public rights of way (PROW) in various areas of Bardsey, Bob Buckenham of PROW has advised that legislation requires that if your garden or hedge backs on to a PROW it is your responsibility to keep hedges and growth cut back and the pathway open. Please do not throw garden rubbish or weeds into the hedge bottom and please keep all paths clear on PROWs.

#### Grants

Bardsey Bowling and Tennis Clubs have been successful in obtaining a grant of 25% towards the costs of necessary work on trees surrounding both clubs in the Conservation Area. The amounts awarded by BPC are £440 for the Bowling Club and £323.75 for the Tennis Club.

The mini community recycling hub inside All Hallows church, is well used by the whole community, for recycling used printer ink cartridges, batteries, blister packs, crisps packets, etc... Until quite recently 'RecycleMeUp' have been recycling the blister packs free of charge, however, there is now going to be an annual charge of £200. A grant form was completed and the Parish Council have agreed a grant for 2025 to cover this cost.

## East Keswick Wildlife Trust

#### **Bardsey Fields Nature Reserve**

(Melanie Smith gives an update on what's been happening)

Over the last few months, our volunteers have been very busy working on the reserve below Bardsey Academy School. With partial funding from Countryside Stewardship hedges have been gapped up, stock proof fencing, gates, holding pens and gravel hardstanding, at the entrances, have been installed.

Have you heard about our Natural Flood Management Project? Two drain pipes take the surface water from Bardsey School's roofs, playgrounds and car park under the reserve, into the mill tale below. (The water that flows from a millwheel after turning it, or the channel in which the water flows.) With permission and funding from Yorkshire Water these two drain pipes have been broken and the water diverted up on to the surface of the field. This will make the upper part of the field wetter. By providing a more natural pathway for the water this will reduce the flow of water into the beck, improve water quality and help alleviate flooding downstream.

Before these works took place certain criteria had to be met.

- \* Eight cross slope leaky barriers were installed below the break out points, to slow the water flow. For the construction, through the ongoing trust management works in Ox Close wood, the volunteers were able to supply 400 two-metre logs, 130 fascines and 440 willow cuttings, from Keswick Marsh Reserve. With the addition of some sheep's wool, all were wired together and stabilised by wooden posts.
- \* Three in-stream leaky barriers were installed in the mill tale. During normal water flow they will have no effect, but in high rainfall they will hold back and slow the flow downstream to Bardsey and Collingham.
- Three woodland copses were planted at strategic points to help absorb the surface water, with post and wire fencing for protection.
- \* Two new cross slope hedges were planted, with post and wire fences to protect them from cows and deer.
- Eleven 8 x 3m parkland enclosures, with post and rail fences, were erected across the site to protect a mixture of what one day will be mature trees and shrubs.

In the future these actions will help to increase habitat diversity and biodiversity across the field, slow the flow of water and improve the health of the beck below.

In time, the reserve will develop into a wood pasture and parkland habitat. This is characterised by open-grown, often old trees, in a grazed environment, representing a rich mosaic of habitats, including grassland, fen and scrub with messy edges, managed through grazing to maintain its open structure.

Some of you may have heard and seen our cooperative of trust members' herd of 11 Dexter cows on site. They are having a real impact by removing the thick dense grass which will allow wild flowers to bloom in the summer.

We would like to thank all those who have given their time to make this project possible.

We hope you can make our summer picnic in Bardsey Fields on the 6 July when you can hear more about what we have achieved so far and our plans for the fenland below Grange Close.

## Eco Chat: Heat Pumps

In efforts to reduce carbon emissions from heating our homes heat pumps have become a favoured option but there is much debate about their suitability. Here's why.

#### Cost

Heat pumps work by extracting heat from the outside air or ground, and transferring it to a central heating system via a heat exchanger. This requires electricity, which is more expensive than both gas and oil. They are also expensive to instal. However they are also far more efficient than gas or oil boilers, and so running costs can be lower, depending on the system being replaced. There are also grants available to help offset the initial cost.

#### Effectiveness

Heat pumps operate at a lower temperature than conventional boilers which means they perform more effectively in well insulated houses and sometimes require larger radiators, which adds to the initial cost. It also means that they can be slower to respond on start-up and work better when kept on constantly, using a thermostat to control room temperature.

#### Noise

Whilst not excessively loud they emit a constant noise, which gets more noticeable when they are working harder in cold weather. This may be more of a nuisance to neighbours than those living in the house itself but no more so than a balanced flue boiler.

#### **Space Required**

This depends on the type and capacity of the system. Air source heat pumps for most houses require a relatively small area outside, as shown in the image below but they also need space inside for the heat exchanger. A hot water cylinder is also required and there may be a need for an expansion tank as well, if linked to a closed system.

In addition ground source heat pumps need land where external pipes can be located underground.

#### **Reliability and Servicing**

In general they need little maintenance provided they are installed correctly in the first place! The average life expectancy of a heat pump is 15+ years and they are generally reliable provided they are maintained properly but they can be expensive to repair when they do go wrong.

#### Yes or No

The decision whether to install a heat pump or not will very much depend on where carbon emission reduction comes on your list of priorities. Heat pumps are a very good low emission option for many homes but minor inconveniences for some can become major barriers to others. The decision to install a heat pump should only be made when you are fully aware of the facts and the implications for your own property. Seek advice from an independent expert first, such as **www.heatgeek.com**, not just someone trying to sell you their product!
