Some weeks ago our church at East Keswick, which is dedicated to St. Mary Magdalene, celebrated its Patronal Festival. As ever a joyous occasion, it concluded with a hymn entitled 'There is a Line of Women Extending Back to Eve', by John L Bell, taken from The Inclusive Church Network, of which our two churches, in East Keswick and Bardsey, are a part.

As inclusive churches we celebrate and affirm every person and do not discriminate. This hymn explores one aspect of this - the prominence of many women in the bible. I have taken as an example the well known story of Ruth, one of only two bible books named after a woman (Esther is the other).

Ruth chooses to accompany her mother-inlaw, Naomi, on her return to Bethlehem in Judah from Moab. They have few resources and face a bleak future. Ruth goes to glean for food at the start of the barley harvest. She meets Boaz who is a relative of Naomi and owns some of the fields. They marry, have a son named Obed and hopefully live happily ever after.

An outline of a simple event that occurred more than three thousand years ago. And yet it still has the power to resonate with us in respect of all women who are experiencing prejudice, rejection, abuse and other challenges. What characteristics of Ruth emerge from the story and are equally important today?

Strength of Character

Ruth chose to be loyal to Naomi in her

troubles when the easier option might have been to stay in Moab with her own people. When Naomi tried to persuade her to stay Ruth said the words "wherever you go, I will go; wherever you live, I will live. Your people will be my people, and your God will be my God." These words were said to Winston Churchill by the American envoy to Britain in the darkest days of World War II. The decision in both cases invoked mission.

As an immigrant in a land that looked down on her race as inferior, her kindness and loyalty became respected and she was taken into their hearts.

Humility

There is no pride or arrogance in her actions. She shows determination to work hard, is kind, appreciative of others and accepts the guidance of Boaz. Mentors can be important to us.

Faith

On the face of it there is nothing very special about Ruth. She starts in difficult circumstances but has faith to believe that God will provide. She may not have been able to see where God was in the mess of her life but He moved in ways for her as for all of us. Her story is a good example of how God can change a life. Of course Ruth was special to God as we all are and none are out of his reach.

And let us remember one very special thing, the book of Ruth ends with a family tree. Their son Obed becomes the father of Jesse who becomes the father of David and centuries later through the line of David Jesus is born in Bethlehem.

God can use the most unlikely of us in ways that we could never imagine.

St Aidan's FoodShare Thanks

Dear friends in Bardsey and East Keswick and the wider parish, the St Aidan's FoodShare in its new incarnation (since the beginning of the pandemic), is by now a well known, well used and well respected part of our ministry and service within the local community.

Now securely established on **Saturdays** between 10.30am-12noon, we see a steady stream of people using this service every week. They are predominantly from our local communities in **Harehills, Gipton,** Burmantofts, Roundhay and Chapeltown, though we also see people walk in/travel in from further afield to make use of our service. We see regulars and one-off/ seasonal use, individuals, couples and families.

Among them are people who have little or no access to social funds, are on benefit support or universal credit, under benefit sanctions or have recently become unemployed, or live among us as refugees and asylum seekers.

Government reports show that Leeds, on the whole, has significant levels of child poverty. It is estimated that over 14,700 children in Leeds aged 0-15 are in the top 10% of the country when it comes to their families suffering from income deprivation.

During 2022, numbers reached through our FoodShare averaged around 300-350 people, though we experience some Saturdays with lower reach and some Saturdays with a higher reach.

There continues a great energy, and a continuing interest amongst volunteers and donors trying to match the continuing need

among the most vulnerable in our community. With the general rise of the cost of living for everyone, our stock is at times very low, and we are so short of certain items that people won't receive even some of the most basic, like pasta or rice, tinned tomatoes or baked beans, or fish.

On a weekly basis posts are published on our Facebook and Twitter feeds, where we reach hundreds of views and are 'liked' and 'shared' and 'followed' by many local individuals and organisations with a responsibility or care for the neighbourhood. Among them are our local councillor, the local Senior Section Officer of the WYP, resources hubs like St Anne's or the Reginald Centre, Food Aid Network, Near Neighbours and Wellsprings Together, raising our profile and signposting those in need to our doors (though the majority of that will of course happen through word of mouth).

We could not do it without our partnerships! And you, wonderful people of Bardsey and East Keswick, are one of our most faithful, consistent and generous partners!

And that does not only recognise the volume of food and the monetary donations. It also recognises very much the countless volunteer hours in collecting, sorting and transporting donations, shopping and delivering, and time spent at St Aidan's prepping or helping with our FoodShare guests on a Saturday. **Thank you!**

Our partnerships also include various supermarkets, Bankside Primary School, Wetherby Foodbank, Leeds City Council, and especially one of our local councillors, Cllr Salma Arif, community groups like the Roundhay WI and Oakwood Neighbourhood Watch and individual supporters and donors, some of whom have been with us from the very start of the pandemic. We are very grateful to all of them.

Supported through grants, monetary donations and fund raising projects we are also subscribers to **Fareshare** (£1,250 per annum) and **Rethink Food** (£1,100 per annum) through whom we receive fresh, frozen and ambient foods on a weekly basis.

Our wonderful volunteers meet twice during the week to collect, receive and sort donations, break down bulk items, bag up fresh fruit/veg where appropriate and sort any fresh bread we receive, and set up the operations for Saturdays, when we also process last minute donations and run the FoodShare on the day (and clean the church up afterwards and reset it for Sunday worship).

Our volunteers are an amazing and dedicated group of people whom I cannot praise enough for their generosity and commitment — thank you!

But back to you, wonderful people of Bardsey and East Keswick, the ongoing weekly donations from you as individuals, gathered, focused and delivered through the parish church, are so much appreciated, as are the grants received from your Parochial Church Council and, through the initiative of one of your parishioners, from the West Riding Masonic Community Fund.

This comes with my gratitude and many blessings for you all.

Seasoned hardwood logs are now for sale. They are a bi-product of conservation management in our local woodland nature reserves. 100% of the proceeds go towards the conservation works and running costs of East Keswick Wildlife Trust. Two crates of logs cost £110 and are delivered on a Friday.

MANAGING OUR WOODLAND

If woodland is left to grow without any management it can become a poor habitat, dominated by mature trees with no variation in size and a dark empty woodland floor.



As woodlands become more precious, we need to actively manage them so that they are as diverse as possible for wildlife. In Ox Close Wood we have maintained the original rides and created open glades. We also have a woodland pasture that is conservation grazed by our Dexter cows.

As the woodland comes into leaf, light is restricted to the woodland floor and the flora dies back. The managed glades and open grazed areas however, allow light into the woodland where wildflowers and many species of butterflies can be seen. In some areas trees have been thinned to allow a wider variety of tree species to flourish. This encourages trees of varying age and a scrub layer, providing a more diverse habitat for woodland birds.

Some areas of the wood are managed by coppicing, where trees are periodically cut back to ground level and new stems sprout from the stumps. This again allows light to the woodland floor and is a sustainable source of wood. Dead wood is left on the ground and standing for beetles, insect eating birds and fungi.

News and meeting update from July 2023

King Charles III Coronation Memorial Benches: Cllr Harrison confirmed The Ward Councillors have agreed to fund the Coronation bench. They are looking into which funding stream the money will come from. The PC is looking into funding a second bench. A Queen Elizabeth Memorial bench is also being investigated

EKSA Pitch Advisory Inspection: Cllr Groves has received the report from Yorkshire Cricket Board identifying ground analysis.

Memorial Planters: It was agreed to wait until autumn for the preferable planting time for the memorial tree. Planters will be placed after the tree has been planted. Cllr Groves has a quote for the planters and will place on hold until later in the year.

East Keswick Sports Association Funding Update: Cllr Groves confirmed West Riding FA has prepared a Football Assessment report which will give us access to funding opportunities. Cllr Groves will follow up potential funding opportunities.

EKSA Long Term Plan: Leeds Superkings Cricket Club are currently in discussions with EKSA and they gave a short presentation at the start of the PC meeting. Cllr Groves confirmed he had approached a ground maintenance company in relation to maintenance of the Sports Ground and is waiting for a reply. It was agreed not to buy any maintenance machinery at present. Cllr Groves confirmed cricket bookings were finalised for the coming year

Pavement Creep: This has been reported to LCC for action.

Adopt a Memorial Tree: Cllr Bailey is working on a scheme to enable villagers to adopt and care for the memorial limes.

Crabtree Lane Car Park Potholes: Cllr Harrison has emailed LCC re using any scalpings left over after the work on Crabtree Lane and asked if they could be used to fill the car park potholes.

Village Walks: Cllrs Batty, Bailey and Waterfield completed the long and short walks in June.

Parish Council Communications: In future the agenda will be included on the Facebook page with a link to the previous meeting minutes. Minutes, once approved, will be displayed in the butchers and library. Cllr Batty to circulate the Annual Report in the next few weeks.

Keswick Wildlife Trust to display wildlife pictures by our club artists. We would like you to vote for the wildlife painting you like the most!


A table and crayons will be available for children (up to any age!) who want to create a picture on the day and display it. A mystery prize will be awarded at the end of the show by an EKWT member.

Bardsey-cum-Rigton **Parish Council Report**

It is with great sadness that we have to report that Mrs June Gallant, our former Clerk, passed away on 26 August. June was Clerk to Bardsey Parish Council for well over 30 years and only retired in December 2021. June was immensely valued by successive Parish Council Chairs and all members of the Council, we all appreciated her vast knowledge and helpful advice, the warmth of her personality and infectious smile. She will be sadly missed.

HIGHWAYS

A58 - Bank Top Bus Stop: There was a lot of rain during the month of July and water was again pooling close to the bus stop at Bank Top. It was again reported to Ben Cornelly, LCC Highways, who stated that this was due in part to the camber of the road and that it was only 18/20 months ago since Highways put a lot of time and effort into trying to resolve this problem. However, it is an ongoing external problem which appears to be almost impossible to resolve.

A58 Church Lane - Cornmill ginnel area: There are many trees beyond the footpath, towards the old railway embankment, which are in an unstable condition. This was reported to LCC with photographs but as yet no response.

Hedges adjoining public rights of way: There are many public rights of way (PROW) in various areas of Bardsey. Bob Buckenham of PROW has advised that legislation requires that if your garden or hedge backs on to a PROW it is your responsibility to keep hedges and growth cut back, and the pathway open. Please do not throw garden rubbish or weeds into the hedge bottom and please keep all paths clear on PROWs.

Hedges overhanging pavements on roads and public highways: We have had many complaints from villagers about hedges encroaching and overhanging pavements, especially on Keswick

Lane, Mill Lane and other areas of the village. Please consider your neighbours and cut back hedges especially if they are narrowing the pavements and becoming a danger to pedestrians, and also please have consideration for people in wheelchairs and parents with prams and pushchairs.

Village Pond: It was reported that a limb of an ash tree had fallen across the pond. It was agreed that it was safe to leave at present and we will continue to monitor the situation.

FUTURE MEETINGS

The date of our September meeting had to be changed from the 20th to the 27th September. The next two meetings will be held on **Wednesday 18 October** and **Wednesday 15 November,** at 7.00 pm in Bardsey Village Hall Committee Room. The first ten minutes will be set aside to deal with any issues raised by residents






